My name is Ilanye LongJohn, and I am honored to serve as a liaison for the Church Periodical Club (CPC). It is a privilege representing the Episcopal Church Woman in the Diocese of Long Island, that is deeply committed to spreading the word of God and promoting literacy and education around the world through the CPC program.

The Church Periodical Club, often referred to as CPC, was founded in 1888 with a simple yet profound mission: to provide reading and educational materials to those who need them but cannot afford them. For over a century, we have been dedicated to fostering a love of reading and learning, supporting educational initiatives, and enhancing literacy within our communities and beyond.

One of the most heartwarming aspects of CPC is our commitment to ensuring that everyone, regardless of their circumstances, has access to the written word. We believe that through Christian books and educational resources, we can open doors to new opportunities, inspire minds, and share the message of God's love and wisdom.

We have several key programs that I'd like to highlight:

- 1. **Miles of Pennies**: This program is a grassroots initiative where we collect pennies (or any amount of currency) to purchase children's books for schools, libraries, and organizations in need. It's incredible how something as small as a penny can contribute to such a meaningful cause.
- 2. **National Books Fund**: Established in 1940, this fund provides grants for books and educational materials to various groups within the Anglican Communion. The National Books Fund helps equip libraries, study groups, and community centers with resources that enrich lives and support Christian Education.
- 3.**CPC Overseas**: Through this initiative, we extend our reach beyond the United States, supplying books and educational materials to Episcopal dioceses and schools around the globe. This program embodies our commitment to global fellowship and support.

I'll be reaching out to various churches in the area to discuss more about the Church Periodical Club Program, and how you can get involved. I look forward to expanding our community and working together to accomplish this important humanitarian mission.

Stay tuned for an upcoming symposium where we will share more information about our programs.
