PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Happy 2025! We are one quarter into this new century. In some ways, it feels just like the last one. A new flu, political discord, economic uncertainty.... It seems like the same old, same old. As we move on in years, many of us become disenchanted with the hoopla surrounding a new year. We refuse to make resolutions or promises to improve. No lists of trying to lose 10 pounds, give up reality TV or some other habit we would like to break. I'm suggesting a more positive approach this year. Here are a few things you may want to consider:

- 1. Read something from your Bible daily or add an additional 5-10 minutes to your daily Bible regimen. If you don't have a daily Bible regimen start one.
- 2. Make a change in your prayer habits. Establish a prayer corner at home or a traveling prayer folio or folder that you can take with you. Put it in your suitcase. Use the 10 or 15 minutes you wait each day for children getting off the bus or part of your commute to add prayer time.
- 3. Join a Religious Book Club. Start or join a Book Club based on books in the spiritual genre. Instead of murder mysteries or popular culture, explore your faith. Read a Christian Book for a change.
- 4. Be Content With What You Have. Every day we are bombarded with things we just "can't do without". Pick a day each week or each month that you "Don't Open Your Wallet". See how much you save on those days when you spend no money. You can put the money you save into CPC. As you are shopping, just say "No" or "Do I really Need this?" Add up what you didn't spend.

Take a look around and see if you can make one little improvement this year. Discuss some of these changes at your chapter meeting this month. Making one or some of these changes may be easier than you think.

This is the day which the Lord has made Let us rejoice and be glad in it. Amen.


